THE NEW BRUNSWICK BANK.

How it was Used by a Ring of Political and Financial Tricksters.

New York, Sept. 16.—A Times special has the following: Mayor William Strong to-day gave an interesting history of the inner working of the ring which has been running the officers of the New Brunswick Bank for the past five or fifteen years, and which is now dissolved by the death of its tool, Charles Hill, the cashier. It was composed, among others, of Joseph F. Fisher, L. D. Jarrard, Charles H. Hill, and Robt. G. Miller. Of these, Fisher is an outcast, Jarrard is serving a term in the Trenton State Prison, Hill is now in the grave, and Miller is practically a nonentity, owing to developments in his trial for the misappropriation of \$28,000 of the city's funds, on which he escaped through a technicality. Mayor Strong said there has probably never been such an uninterrupted succession of political crimes and municipal dishonesty as is shown by the operations of this set of worthies. They were first brought into notice at the time of the suicide of city treasurer Croft, six years ago, and went without discovery until long after \$100,000 of the city's funds had disappeared into their pockets. Their operations were the same in kind as those which have been carried on since Croft's death. The revelations have shown that one of the most profitable methods employed was to ostensibly discount the notes of the city at 50 cents on the dollar, and divide a handsome surplus. The revenue of the city is \$94,000 per annum; its expenditures \$110,000. This deficit had been going on for many years, and the credit of the city was not of the best, and it was necessary to employ the services of a bank to carry it on. The suspended bank was chosen entirely on account of Hill's connection with it. The ring of which Hill was the tool had first got its clutches on him through political manipulation. They controlled the primaries and sought elections, and purchased money for the necessary votes was furnished by Hill. The ring thus got him into their power, and when he was inclined to draw back they put the screws on by threatening exposure. Henceforth he was their willing but not active instrument.
