Crooked Bank Failure at Cheney.

CHENEY, Sept. 17.—E. J. S. Danford t Co., bankers, closed their doors to-lay. Danford and wife have absconded with all the assets, including the deposits. D. Ainsworth, cashier, is under arrest, while Danford tele-graphs from Victoria that he is in fine health. The loss to depositors amounts to about \$15,000, divided in small sums, mostly among people outside of the town. It does not disturb business in any way. Danford failed in Kansas, and would have been hanged by the depositors if Ainsworth had not come to his rescue and ransomed him by paying up the cow boys. Now Ainsworth is in the same fix, and his life is in jeopardy unless Danford comes to his rescuand pays every depositor in full. The people are fearfully incensed. and the sooner Danford responds the better for the neck of his friend.

England Victorious.

London, Sept. 17.—In the rowing match, five miles for £600, at Southampton, the eighteen-oared crew beat by two minutes the cutter's crew of the U. S. flagship Lancaster. The American crew of the cutter Uncle Sam handled fourteen oars. The Southampton crew, although the Americans had a slight lead at the start, were soon ahead. The victors were winners by 200 yards. Time, 42 min. 27 sec. Betting at the start was 3 to 1 on the Americans. The American club this evening entertained both crews. Bailey, coxswain of the American cutter, said the Uncle Sam was never beaten before. The crew of the Lancaster are read to back the Uncle Sam for from £100 to £1,000 against any other boat in England. The match excited great

Alleged Frauds in Washington Territory

The S. F. Alta of the 17th says "The way in which the Chinese re-striction act is being juggled in Washington territory is a disgrace to the administration, and a sufficient reason for demanding a change of parties, in order that the laws may be honestly enforced. An official of the British government in Victoria is authority for the statement that 500 Chinese have been smuggled into the United States from British Columbia during the last six months. Such travesty on the enforcement of the law would not be tolerated at San Francisco, but there seems to be no present hope of checking the frauds in Washington territory, by which 500 Chinese are illegally added to the population of the United States in a space of six months.

Berlin, Sept. 17.—The farewell at the frontier to the Emperor of Germany, by the czar and czarina, was of the most affectionate character. The emperor frequently kissed the czarina and Grand Duchess, Maria Paulovna. He embraced and thrice kissed the emperor of Austria, the czar and the Russian grand dukes, and expressed sincere thanks for their hospitality. When the train departed the assemblage cheered the German emperor, who stood at a win-dow of his car, waving his adieus until out of sight.

The Oregon Short Line will be completed to Huntington, the agreed point with the Oregon Railway and Navigation company's road, by Octo-ber 15. By November 1 connection will be effected; There is every rea-son to believe that this will immedianticipated.

Paris, Sept. 16 .- Le Paris publishes an inspired article to-day, in which the idea that the French should accept arbitration in the difficulty with China is indignantly rejected

SHANGHAI, Sept. 17.-Two thousand French troops landed to-day at Kenpai Pass on the Min river, below Foo Chow, and attacked the Chinese. The latter were defeated with heavy loss and are in full retreat.


