CHANCE.
How Trivial Incidents Have Changed the Life and Character.
It has been said that there never was an individual born whose whole career did not hinge upon some chance of accident. Whether or not an assertion so broad and sweeping be true it is a fact that the history of men who have stood in the foremost rank is rich with instances to the effect of happy chance or accident.
Thus Wallenstein, the magnificent, the great captain, who never lost a battle, until the age of manhood, little better than an idiot, until a chance fall down a stone staircase injured his head, but cleared his clouded intellect. Mahillon was a mere idiot until a similar happy chance fall restored him to reason. The golden genius of Charles Dickens might have remained forever unsuspected but for chance. Dickens' early life was ennobled of the stage. After many attempts he succeeded in gaining a promise from the manager of the Covent Garden theater to accord his histrionic powers a private hearing. A chance exposure to a rainstorm brought on a cold which prevented Dickens from keeping his engagement and thus the stage lost an aspiring actor, while literature gained a king. Thorwaldsen, the great Danish sculptor, after working for months unrecognized in Rome, determined in despair to return home and lay down the sculptor's chisel forever. A chance error by a careless clerk in drawing his passport delayed him twenty-four hours. During that interval of waiting Mr. Hope walked into his studio, admired his Jason in clay and aroused the despondent Dane's hope by ordering a copy in marble. Thorwaldsen unpacked his boxes and never afterward in his long career lacked patronage. Rachel, the great tragedienne, was when a child a street singer, and such might have passed into womanhood and old age had not a party of critics dining together chanced to hear her loud, clear voice beneath their window. They observed the child's wonderful face and eyes, and in a kindly spirit, aroused no doubt by the wine they had drunk, proposed to her patrons to place her in the conservatory of a pupil. Sir Walter Raleigh would probably have remained out of favor with the court had Elizabeth, on her walk to the Tower, chanced to take a path less muddy. Every reader of history knows the story, how the gallant Sir Walter spread his cloak beneath the royal feet and was rewarded with his sovereignty, a smile and speedy restoration to favor. Potemkin, the favorite of Catherine II., and the founder of the powerful Russian family which bears his name, would doubtless have remained an obscure soldier had not a trivial accident - a chance, in fact - changed his destiny. After Catherine had deposed her weak husband and herself assumed the scepter, she was accustomed to parade the streets of St. Petersburg, sword in hand, at the head of her troops. One day Potemkin noticed her sword bore no knot. He boldly stepped forward, braving the knot for his insubordination, and offered his. The czarina accepted it and, struck by the handsome young lieutenant, asked his name and regiment, and if he would not like to serve her in the palace. Haul Pasha, the sultan's chief of artillery and most trusted adviser, was a timer. Employed in the palace, he offered to make a valuable French clock, as no clockmaker was available, and did the work so well that the sultan bade him lay aside his tin snip, service and serve him. Sir Robert Wilson, one of England's best generals, owes his elevation from a desk in a solicitor's office to a chance meeting with the Duke of York in the rain. Of Benjamin Disraeli there was a story current years ago to prove that the building of his greatness was helped along by chance. In his youth he was a reckless spendthrift. His ambition was to lead his party, but such was the state of his finances that at one time it was doubtful whether he could longer support the expense of a seat in parliament. Accident, or chance, threw him in the way of a noted money lender in London, who liked the brilliant young dandy on his first sight and did what he had never done before nor afterward to any man, lent Disraeli £5,000 on no other security than his genius and ambition. Disraeli never forgot the service, and never tired, so the story goes, of returning it in the various ways which his after influence enabled him to do.

George Stephenson, the inventor of the locomotive, was born with taste for mechanics. His parents were too wretchedly poor to give him the advantages of education. At a very tender age he was compelled to work as a pit-boy at twopenny a day to help support the family. Deep in the mines, shut out from everything that cheered the senses, young Stephenson found much to stimulate his mechanical bent. He mastered the hoisting machinery and longed to be allowed to take charge of it. One day the engineer chanced to stumble and injured himself. Young Stephenson promptly offered to supply his place and proved his skill so well that the mine superintendent gave him permanent charge of the machinery, and thus gave him an opportunity to observe and think and build until the "Rocket" appeared as a result of his labors.

LONDON, Oct. 3. - Sir Evelyn Baring has sent a dispatch to the government that Gordon, after having bombarded Berber for some time, effected an entry into the place and recaptured it. The rebels and hostile inhabitants fled when the bombardment ceased. The fall of Berber will enable Colonel Kitchener to reach Gordon from Dongola and ascertain his wishes regarding the Nile expedition.

CONNECTICUT'S BLUE LAWS.
The Days When Puritan Regulations Were in Force.
The good people of Connecticut must have had lively times in the old days, when the famous blue laws were in force. Here is a compendium of the Puritan regulations which were in force in the early part of the last century.
The governor and magistrates convened in general assembly and full power under God of the independent dominion. From the determination of the assembly no appeal shall be made.
Whoever says there is a power and jurisdiction above and over this dominion shall suffer death and loss of property.
Conspirators attempting to change or overturn this dominion, shall suffer death.
The judges shall determine controversies without a jury.
No one shall be a freeman and give a vote unless he be converted and a member in full communion with one of the churches allowed in this community.
No man shall hold any office who is not sound in the faith and faithful to this dominion, and whoever takes a vote to such a person shall pay a fine of twenty shillings for the first offense, and for the second he shall be disfranchised.
Each freeman shall swear by the blessing of God to bear the true allegiance to this dominion, and that Jesus is the only king.
No Quaker or dissenter from the worship of the established dominion shall be allowed to give a vote for the election of magistrates or any officer.
No food or lodgings shall be afforded a Quaker, Adomite, or heretic.
If any person takes Quaker he shall be banished and not allowed to return but upon pain of death.
No priest shall abide in this dominion; he shall be banished, and suffer death on his return. Priests may be seized by any one without a warrant.
No one is to cross a ferry but with an authorized ferry-man.
No one shall run on the Sabbath day, or walk in his garden or elsewhere, except seasonably to and from meeting.
No one shall travel, cook victuals, make beds, sweep house, cut hair or shave on the Sabbath day.
No woman shall kiss her child on the Sabbath or fasting day.
The Sabbath shall begin at sunset on Saturday.
To pick an ear of corn growing in a neighbor's garden shall be deemed theft.
A person accused of trespass in the night shall be judged guilty, unless he clear himself by his oath.
When it appears that an accused has confederates, and he refuses to discover them, he may be racked.
No one shall buy or sell land without permission of the selectmen.
Whoever publishes a lie to the prejudice of his neighbor shall sit in stocks or be whipped fifteen stripes.
No minister shall keep a school.
Whoever brings cards or dice into this dominion shall pay a fine of 25.
Whoever wears clothes trimmed with gold, silver or bone lace above two shillings by the yard shall be presented to the grand jurors, and the selectmen shall tax the offender at £300 estate.
A debtor in prison swearing he has no estate shall be let out and sold to make satisfaction.
Whoever sets fire in the woods and it burns a house shall suffer death; and if he is suspected of doing this crime shall be imprisoned without benefit of bail.
No one shall read common prayer, keep Christmas or saints' days, make minced pies, play cards, or play on any instrument of music, except the drum, trumpet and Jews' harp.
No gospel minister shall join people in marriage, the magistrates may do it with less scandal to Christ's church.
When parents refuse their children convenient marriages the magistrates shall determine the point.
Fornication shall be punished by compelling marriage, as the court may direct.
Adultery shall be punished with death.
A man that strikes his wife shall pay a fine of £10; a woman that strikes her husband shall be punished at the discretion of the court.
A wife shall be deemed good evidence against her husband.
No man shall court a maid in person or by letter without first obtaining the consent of her parents. Five pounds penalty for the first offense; £10 for the second, and for the third imprisonment during pleasure.
Married persons must live together or be imprisoned.
Every male shall have his hair cut round, according to a cap.
