LABOR AND CAPITAL.

BEN BUTLER is going around the country making speeches. His assertions are applauded because they cannot be successfully contradicted.

This is about all he does is to say what every one concedes, but he ingeniously twists facts to make it appear that capital and labor are antagonized, and that those who have no capital can best help themselves by making it unpleasant for its possessors.

The discussion of "the relations of labor and capital" has not hitherto been very fruitful. It has been confused by ambiguous definitions.

The capitalist employer assumes the direction of the business, and takes all the risk, for the capital must be consumed in the industrial process, and whether it will be found again in the product or not depends upon the good judgment and foresight with which the capital and labor have been applied.

The World publishes a table giving the estimated vote of New York state by counties which figures up a majority for Cleveland of 25,000.

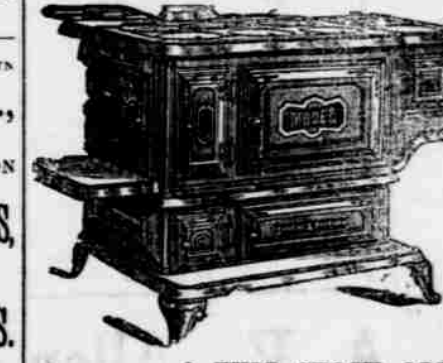
