FOOD FISHES OF THE NORTHWEST. II. THE HALIBUT. The common halibut of the Atlantic, "Hippoglossus vulgaris," is an Arctic species, which extends along the coasts of Europe and eastern North America, and is identical with the halibut of Northwest America.

But when it is freshened and slightly smoked, it is considered a delicacy, and it will undoubtedly become an article of commercial value to Washington territory, as smoked halibut is a great factor in the eastern fish markets, and immense quantities are consumed by the people of the interior towns and cities.

The principal fishing of Washington territory for halibut is on the banks off the entrance to the Straits of Fuca, where considerable numbers are taken annually by Makah Indians of Cape Flattery.

Of the extent of the fishing banks along the coast of Oregon and Washington territory, nothing whatever is known. The only surveys that have been made are those by Captain Richards, U. S. N., in H. M. ships Plumper and Hecla.
