How Indiana Stands.

Indiana is made a critical state by the fact that for ten years the National or Greenback party has held the balance of power.

The National party polled 16,233 votes, while the Democrats polled 182,154 and the Republicans 164,932.

This was a state election, but it gave the first idea of the power of the third party. In the presidential year of 1876 the National vote was reduced to 9,538 and the two great parties ran almost neck and neck.

The Greenback party in 1874 scored 212,525 and the Republicans 208,111. The state election two years after, in 1876 showed the extraordinary national vote of 39,451 on secretary of state.

The Garfield election cut this down to 12,986, and it was only raised to 13,520 in the state election in 1882.

These figures, however, show the importance of the Greenback party in a state which has given an average plurality in six elections, since 1872, of not over 12,000.

This plurality has ranged from 22,507, when the Republicans swept the state in 1882, down to 5,415, when the Democrats carried it in the Tilden campaign.

The state went for Garfield by 6,642 plurality, a vote which would have been considerably larger had it not been for the 12,085 Greenback votes.

The defect comes pretty equally from both of the great parties, but the problem in this campaign is to determine toward which side it will incline.

If there is any sentiment that needs to be developed in this country, from the St. Lawrence to the Greenback party, and from the Atlantic to the Pacific, and in every rank and class of American society, it is the ethical sentiment respecting personal responsibility for the use of the ballot in the interests of good government.

This voting merely to express an opinion, to exhibit our principles, to have our own way, to show our independence, to show responsibility to ourselves, to some candidate, to promote some purely party interests, or to accomplish any or all of a hundred things for which the ballot was not intended, is an evil running through all the ranks of the American citizenship from the political dilettante who amuses himself with his "doll candidate" down for up, as you may prefer to the ruffian who multiplies the effect of his ballot by the aid of the bowie knife and the revolver.

Little will be done for the correction of this evil until voters are made to feel their responsibility for the immediate result of their ballots in the election of rulers.
