Augusta, Nov. 5 .- Blaine was up most of the night receiving election returns, and is sleeping late this morning. Dispatches received up to 2 P. M. confirm earlier ones as to the Republican victory in New York, but give lower figures. Florida and Virginia are reported.

AUGUSTA, Nov. 5.—About 2 o'clock

Blaine received the following from Albany: "The state is surely safe." This was signed by J. M. Baily. At the same time a dispatch was received from Denver, stating that Colorado had gone Republican by 4,000 majority.

Augusta, Nov. 5.—This city was excited all day over election returns. Many congratulatory dispatches were received from all quarters by Blaine. About noon Senator Mahone telegraphed confirmation of the report that Virginia had gone Republican. The news was very consolatory to those of Blaine's friends who were still doubtful about New York. Early in the evening a dispatch was received announcing that the state of Califor-nia had declared for Blaine and Lo-gan by a majority of 10,000, Nevada by a good majority and Oregon by at least 1,000. Several discouraging dispatches were received from Indiana, which had previously been regarded as certain for the Republicans, but Blaine's friends were not disturbed, because they claimed their candidate could be elected without New York. About 9 o'clook, however, a message was received from Michener, secre-tary of the Indiana Republican State committee, stating that although the state was close, Blaine and Logan would almost certainly have a small plurality. Almost immediately after this came the following from New York: "I have accurate returns from every election district, save No. 1837, in the state, and making ample allowance for that, I am sure you have carried the state." This was signed by S. B. French, superintendent of the board of police. From New Orleans came an an-

nouncement of Republican gains on members of congress, and from Wis-consin and Michigan assurances that these states were all right.

Blaine remained quietly at home all day, receiving returns, and being still somewhat hoarse, spent most of his time in his room, to avoid the fa-tigue of talking, to which he would be subjected had he remained with his friends.

Agout 10 o'ciock a private dispatch was received, announcing great Re-publican gains in Indiana, and cer-tain victory for Blaine and Logan. About half past ten more congratulations came in from widely separated points, indicative that the news of Blaine's election has gone all over the country.

ALBANY, Nov. 6.—The Argus says:
"Cleveland is elected, and he will be
inaugurated. States not at all in
doubt elect Cleveland and Hendricks, who will take the seats to which the people have appointed them. Com-munications to the Argus to-day from counties of New York demonstrate the election of the Democratic elect-ors. Having been made Democratic by the people, New York will remain to be declared and be counted Democratic, and whatever is necessary to this act of truth and justice will be thoroughly and fearlessly done.


