

Oats are not a good crop to precede wheat, and to avoid the chances of loss of seed, some farmers after plowing their oat ground let it lie until spring and sow spring grain. It is severe on the land, but strong, heavy soil will bear a good deal of cropping where it is fall plowed. With liberal use of fertilizers, oats can be grown.


