A world's fair is to be held in St. Louis in 1892 to celebrate the discovery of America by Columbus.

It is a noticeable fact that the first Republican president elected, and the last Republican president elected (up to the present time), were both assassinated.

Dr. Von, the weather prophet, says: "I will venture to predict that there will be more brilliant sunsets, and the sky will be even redder than last year, every cold spell this fall and winter. When we have a brilliant sunset the wind will shift to the south, and it will grow warmer, and three days afterward it will rain."

Up in the Yakima country a doctor with a practice of \$1200 has only collected \$16 in cash in the last twenty months. The rest has been taken in orders on stores, saw-mills, lime-kilns, tailors, undertakers and well-diggers. One account of \$7 was taken out in fiddling, and the fiddler could only play one tune.

THOMAS A. EDISON says he has given himself five years to discover the short cut by which electricity can be generated directly from coal without the use of the steam engine. He says: "The great secret of doing away with the intermediary furnaces, boilers, steam engines and dynamos, will be found—probably within ten years."

The Washington monument on Thursday reached a greater height than that of any structure in the world, being 520 feet and 10 inches above the floor of the monument. The next highest structure in the world is the spire of the Cologne cathedral, which towers 515 feet above the floor of the building. It is estimated it will take but twenty-five working days to complete the monument, so there is no doubt of its being finished in time for dedication the 22d of February.

CONCERNING our state representation in the event of Cleveland's election a singular state of affairs will arise. After the expiration of Senator Slater's term of office and on the day that the inauguration takes place there will not be a single congressional representative from Oregon in harmony with the Democratic executive. The same precise state of affairs will exist in California. This is the first time such a thing has occurred in any northern state. The result will be that the Democratic president will have no one to advise with regarding who should be appointed to fill sundry offices in this state, for it is probable that there are Democrats who could be induced to take Federal positions were they offered to them.

"Buy where you can buy the cheapest," is the motto of all free trade theorists, and of course is noted on by England. But somehow or other the ancient motto every now and then gets somebody into trouble. The last victim was the English government itself, which bought powder from a German firm because they sold cheaper than English powder makers. Thereupon one of the latter called the attention of the government to the fact that powder could not be made at an hour's notice, and that as it was bought in Germany in time of peace for economy's sake, the English makers would not be able to keep such a supply on hand as would be available in time of war. And home industry is patronized now for the powder supply.

SOME of the lumber trade journals state that a new method of tree felling by dynamite has been successfully introduced. A cartridge of that explosive substance is placed in a channel bored directly under the tree to be operated upon, and when exploded, the tree is simply forced up bodily and falls intact on its side. If the system works as well as it is represented to do, and the tree is not fractured by the force of the explosion, a large proportion of valuable wood at the base of the trunk can be utilized which is now lost. This method seems admirably adapted for clearing forest properties and converting them into arable land, as it brings up the roots of the tree at one operation, and dispenses with the tedious and costly process of grubbing out the roots of the felled timber. This latter work was a herculean task in many of the north-western states, such as Ohio, Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin, and also in Canada. Many a farmer in Canada wore his life out in removing stumps, and died before the work was fully accomplished.
