He was especially addressing his remarks to an old friend, and a lull had oc-curred in the conversation. At this he turned to this friend, whose hair had grown remarkably thin within a few years, and said: "I am sorry, Major, to see that you are growing

"Yes," replied the major, "but that "As for that," returned Corwin,
"Casar had fits." While the crowd
were laughing at this retort, Mr. Cor-
