I have been on it for three days in a blind-ing snow storm, with the weather so cold it would freeze your nose if you poked it out of the cabin door. It is a trifle warmer than the rest of the ocean, and it is full of floating sea-

ocean, and it is full of floating sea-weed, and the weed is no good, and that's about the amount of the gulf stream. In winter there is not heat enough to melt a cake of ice, and in summer it's about as warm as board ing house coffee.-Ex.
