ion wuz to be in order.

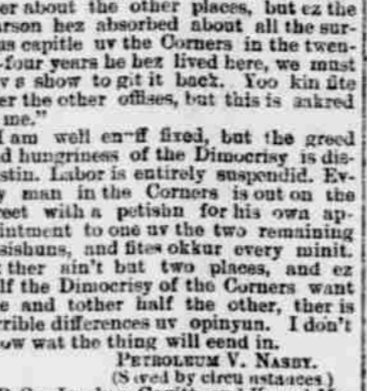

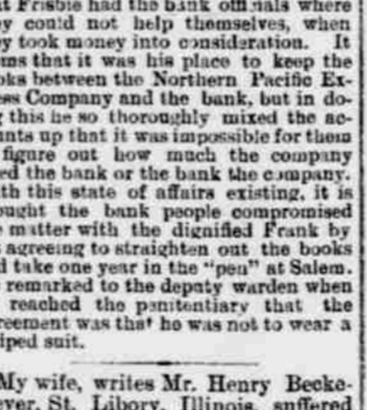

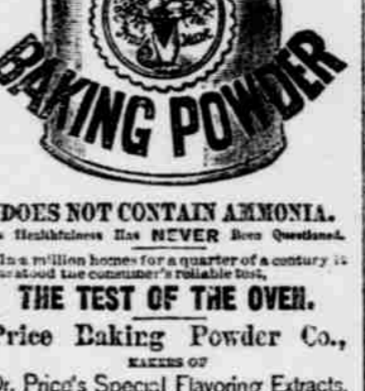
