It has long been main-tained in theory that the Nile could be made navigable to the equator. The difficulty to be encountered is not a lack of water, but rather the control of water. The cheapest means of transportation even now are those offered by great rivers. The Mississippi can float cargoes for twen-ty-five hundred miles cheaper than they can be transported by railroad. Now that so much attention has been turned to the cutting of great canals like the Panama, the Nicaragua and the one across the isthmus of Corinth, ti is natural that the great rivers of the world, closed to navigation by great physical obstacles, should also receive the attention of engineers. 
