A CONTINENTAL WATER-WAY.

Two of the great rivers of the world

rise near the heart of the African

continent. The Nile has its sources

in a number of lakes, and its affluents

south of the equator. Its two great

branches unite at Khartoum. A

French syndicate proposes to improve

the navigation of this great water-

way, making it navigable for steamers

from Alexandria to Khartoum, and

beyond. The trip from Alexandria

to Khartoum would then be as dis-

tance, compare very well with that

from New Orleans to St. Paul. The

enterprise would not involve greater

difficulties than were encountered in

the construction of the Suez canal,

and probably would not involve so

great an outlay. Nothing is too hard

for the modern engineer if ever he

has the financial backing. He sees

in this instance one of the great rivers

of the world extending into the heart

of a continent practically useless for

navigation for nearly two-thirds of

its distance. Rapids, rocks, reefs,

sand-bars, a great volume of water

coming down from the mountains of

the equatorial regions, great lakes

which act as reservoirs. All the re-

sources are there.

But the chief importance of the

river for more than two thousand

years has been on account of the wa-

ter furnished for irrigating purposes

in lower Egypt. By means of locks,

dams and other well-known hydraulic

improvements the modern engineer

will convert the river into a navi-

gable water-way the year round. Of

course the syndicate would want tolls

by way of income on the capital in-

vested. The khedive will be asked

to assent to the proposition of the

syndicate. It has long been main-
