POSTMASTERS. Next to the clerks in the department at Washington the most dignified people in the country at the present time are the postmasters. Every postmaster dreams that a hungry Democrat is swinging an axe where with to chop off his official head and throw it in a basket. And as there are 60,017 postmasters in this country with about 17,000 clerks, the dismay is pretty general and widespread. The offices are not all well kept. There are only 2,400 postmasters who receive over \$1,000 a year and many thousands would probably care nothing if they were relieved of their office. But men hate to be turned out even of petty offices. The trouble with the postal service is that postmasters are appointed for a fixed term of four years. At the expiration of this term there is a vacancy in the office; the incumbent must be reappointed and give new bonds, or a new man must be appointed in his place. Hence, whatever a new president may desire, for the sake of peace and quietness he cannot help making a certain number of appointments, and to fill these members of congress will hardly let him appoint political opponents. So with the postmaster general. Of the 50,017 postmasters, 4,694 are appointed by the postmaster general and only 3,523 by the president. The new postmaster general will have a hard time with congressmen if he makes many reappointments.

As a general rule the postmaster is the political boss in his district. This is of course not the rule in great cities, where bosses sometimes spring up from whisky saloons. But in country towns the postmaster is recognized as the official representative of the party in power. He is usually a well-informed man; he reads more papers than the grocer or the dry goods dealer; he knows every body, and is an official servant of the United States, his pride compels him to assume a representative position. He is consulted in regard to political meetings, party organization and so forth. When money is wanted for party purposes he is expected to head the subscription list. He is not in so direct a line for political promotion as the district attorney, but he represents the United States, which is more than the prosecutor of thieves can say.

It might be a good idea, and it would please the civil service reformers—to give to women a larger share of the postoffice than they now enjoy. Women make famous postmistresses and they are not expected to have any politics.
