Monday, December 29th, 1884.  
FIRST DAY.  
Owing to the ice blockade in the Columbia river, the board convened at Cathlamet on Monday, December 29th, instead of the 22nd inst. Present, James Wright and Thomas Irvin, (Jesse Baker absent), commissioners; S. F. Albert, sheriff, and C. C. Shepherd, auditor and clerk of the board.

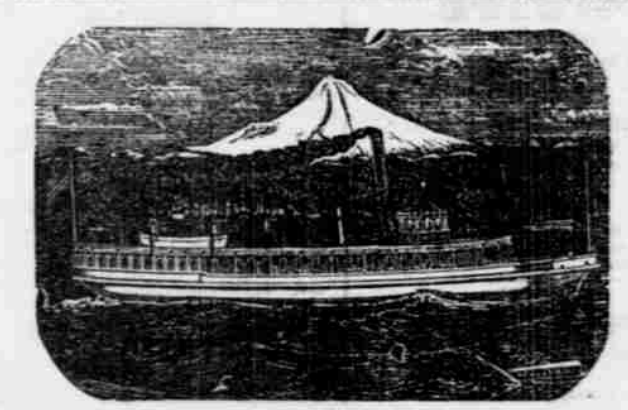
