THE LAND GRANT FORFEITURE.

We publish this morning the full text of Senator Dolph's speech on the forfeiture of the Astoria land grant. His course was a manly and open one, and while personally opposed to the forfeiture he voted for it because he thought the people of this section of the state wanted it. Senator Slater deserves equal commendation. To his untiring zeal is greatly due the success of the measure. He kept his word to the people of Astoria and did just what he promised them, when he spoke here last October, that he would do when he got back to Washington.

The bill now that it has passed the senate, goes to a conference committee. The bill that Mr. George voted against last winter, and which passed the house all the same, provided for the forfeiture of all the grant: the bill that Senators Slater and Dolph supported and which passed the senate last Tuesday, provides for the forfeiture of the unearned part of the land grant—all that THE ASTORIAN demanded. The entanglements that have arisen in the conference committee on the Atlantic and Pacific, and other bills, may greatly delay and possibly frustrate the final acceptance of the bill, but we are of the same belief now as when we began the agitation nearly forty months ago—that the land between here and Forest Grove will be forfeited.

For Right is Right And still holds good; And Right the day must win. To doubt would be disloyalty; To flatter would be sin.

The commercial editor of the Oregonian sort of lets the cat out of the bag, classically speaking, in the course of some explanations concerning wheat quotations in yesterday's issue. Talking about handling wheat he says: "Every time a product is handled some expense is added. The warehouseman must have his charges, and when possible a profit additional. If he sells to a dealer, the latter must also receive a profit in transporting it to the shipper. If the warehouseman sells directly to the shipper he wants all there is to be made out of the transaction." All this is so; and nothing but the exact fact is stated. But what a splendid argument is here made for shipping the wheat from Astoria!

Now that THE ASTORIAN by its persistence has succeeded in securing the forfeiture of the Astoria land grant, it asks its contemporaries throughout the state to aid it in its advocacy of a free river. Unity of effort will do it. This is not a local question. It appeals to the best interests of every one in Oregon. We have the power. Let us make it felt. Power rightly used is a benefit. Why fritter our strength in idle discussions as to what politician may succeed in setting up the pins, when the great material interests of our state need advocacy!

They have a good joke on John Roach, says the Detroit Free Press. He has for years been chock-full of the "pauper wages of Europe," but the last end in his ship yards dropped wages 5 per cent below anything paid in England for twenty-five years.

Mr. Arthur's senatorial candidacy brings to mind the fact that Andrew Johnson was a candidate for senator in Tennessee the next year after retiring from the presidency, and was beaten by only two votes.

The Olympia Transcript thinks that when Washington does come in as a state that it should be divided. Our neighbor should harbor no such doctrine. "In union is strength."
