John H. Leve, a private in the First Oregon Cavalry, enlisted at Salem in February, 1862, will, in a few days, draw a back pension of \$1,080, says the Oregon City Courier. He lately arrived in Oregon City from Polk county. A pension was awarded him for "arrow wound in left hip" received in a brush with the Redskins in eastern Oregon in 1864, but pay commenced from July 7, 1875, which leaves nine years, from his discharge in 1865, which has not been acted upon yet by the pension bureau. He receives for the future a monthly pension of \$8.

Capt. Littlefield, of Marshfield, has appropriated about 240 acres of the public domain at Coos Head, at the mouth of the bay, for the government; the same is withdrawn from sale by the president of the United States on his recommendation. The selection is made on account of the rock for the works; but in case of war it would also be the proper location for fortifications.

Two or three of the smaller contractors under Nelson Bennett, are reported to have thrown up their contracts, and about three hundred men will be thrown out of employment, of whom a number will probably go to British Columbia to work on the Canadian Pacific road.
