A detailed account of the late uprising in Corea is printed in the Japan Mail. 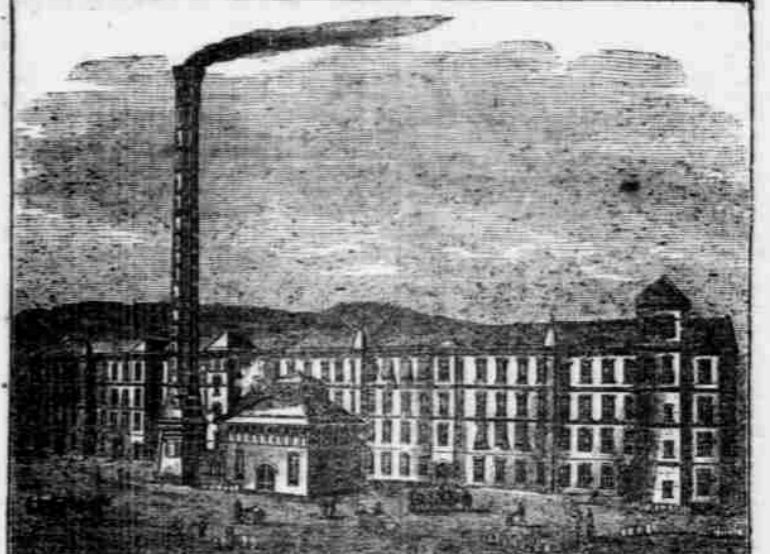
