

In most cases the man who takes a pre-emption claim upon such ands intends to secure his title for the timber by an evasion of the law so far as cultivation is concerned. The settler who would make the neessary bona fide improvement upon a quarter section of this heavily timed land, such as is sought for its timber, and should comply with the requirements of the homestead law, would prove a damage rather than a benefit to that portion of the county. The cost of clearing such land is at least \$100 per acre, besides which the clearing would endanger the valuable imber upon public and private lands by the liability of the spreading of fires which are always set in the clearings during the dry season. Under the present ruling of the interior department the most valuable timber cannot be purchased under the act of June 3, 1878, provided the land could be cultivated after the timber is removed. To expect any one to make a home upon such land until the timber is removed for commercial purposes is idle. To allow parties to secure such heavily timbered land under any law upon the pretense that it is for a home is a farce. It is not taken for
