CHICAGO, Jan. 23.-The *Tribune's* Kansas City, Mo., special says: An infernal dynamite machine was discovered at the east end of the Hannibal and St. Joe railroad bridge at this point early this morning. The machine consisted of a tin box about twelve inches square, covered with black cloth and containing fully twelve pounds of dynamite, packed so as to be carried safely. The box was found by a railroad laborer, whose curiosity got the better of him, and he pried the box lid off, exposing the contents. He then brought it over and delivered it to the police authorities of this city. Shortly after this discovery it became known in detective circles that there were two London detectives in this city, and after a great deal of trouble a reporter interviewed one of them, who admitted his profession, but concealed his name. He stated that the package of dynamite was thrown off of last night's Wabash train from Chicago. He says the person who threw it off was one John Meehan, a well-known Irish conspirator whom the detectives have been shadowing ever since he left England by the steamer *Bohemia* four weeks ago. Both detectives came over in the same ship and landed in New York on the day of the attempted assassination of Captain Phelan. Meehan reported at once at the office of O'Donovan Rossa. The detective shadowed him and found that he obtained a package of dynamite in New York and started west a few days ago. They followed him and were on the point of capturing him last night, when, becoming alarmed, Meehan threw the dynamite out of a car window. The detectives made no attempt to arrest him afterwards, but allowed him to take a train for San Francisco, one of them taking passage on the same train and the other remaining here. The detective says Meehan was, it is supposed, delegated by the Irish dynamiters to execute some hellish outrage, and the theory is that he is on his way to Australia to blow up a prison where Fenian prisoners are confined. This is in substance the story the *Journal* will print upon what it claims as exclusive information well authenticated and thoroughly reliable. The police authorities were approached regarding the matter, but beyond admitting the fact of finding a box of dynamite, they are silent.

ITEMS FROM ABROAD.

Divers in the vicinity of Gibraltar have so far found 102 large guns. Paris has 62,827 dogs, and the yearly licenses amount to over \$100,000. In London 140 tons of chlorine of lime are daily used for the deodorizing of the sewer outlets. "M. Frederic de Gebhard de New York" is noted by *Le Figaro* as among the arrivals in Paris. A crane capable of lifting 147 tons is being constructed at Hamburg. It will be the largest in Europe. Port wine, instead of going out of fashion, as has often been asserted of late, is said by a French house to be growing steadily in popular favor. W. E. Gladstone, the premier, has an elder brother who has no less than thirteen farms on his hands. He also owns 45,000 acres in Kincardineshire. There are 2,380 co-operative societies in Germany, with a membership of over 1,000,000, and last year they purchased over \$375,000,000 worth of goods. Prince Albert Victor, the elder son of the prince of Wales, came of age on the 8th inst. The occasion was celebrated in England with great rejoicings. The German people, who were only 25,000,000 in 1815, are now 45,000,000, and their present rate of increase is greater than that of any other European race. Excavations at Pompeii continue and have recently disclosed fine mural decorations, all of which portray vices. Virtue seems not to have been of so great antiquity. Lord Lytton devotes twenty-one pages of the *Nineteenth Century* to Mary Anderson's "Juliet", in which he criticises Miss Anderson's critics and deluges her with praise. Ladies of the English aristocracy are engaged in a fur craze, and encase themselves in that material from head looking as if they had just walked home from Russia. The latest fashionable garment in Paris is a short zouave jacket reaching just below the armpits. It is a pity it is so short. The cholera item has disappeared from the bills of mortality, and Paris has again a lower death-rate than is usual at this time of the year. A bronze statue of Virgil, standing on an antique column, has recently been erected in the little town of Pietole, the modern site of Andes - where it is claimed the poet was born. You Can Have It. 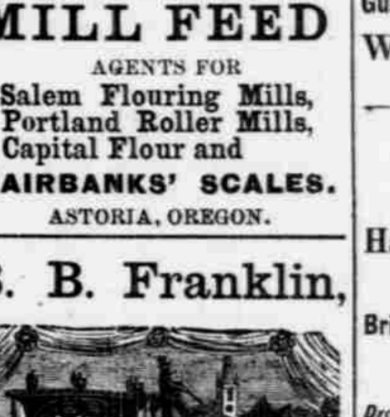
