AUTOMATIC ARCTIC EXPLORA-TION.

Arctic exploration is the recent dis- or thickness. covery of an ice floe in the waters of Davis' strait west of Greenlandwhich had drifted from a point in the Arctic ocean northeast of the Lena delta-where the crew of the Jeanette divided into three parties and took to the open waters-to the southernmost point of Greenland, and north again to Baffin's bay. Upon this floe were a corpse, and many including an article of wearing apparel marked with the name of Seaman company with seaman Nindermann before last. went a few miles ahead of poor De Long, and lived to write the most extraordinary experience ever penned by a human hand. 




