POLITICAL MEETING AT BIRMINGHAM.
LONDON, Jan. 29.—The meeting at Birmingham this evening was an impressive liberal demonstration. A resolution was unanimously passed expressing sympathy with the conservative party with their great loss in the death of the "gallant soldier, and the patriotic and kind-hearted Barnaby."
Bright, in alluding to the American tariff, said the farmers of the United States are not permitted to exchange their products with the artisans of Birmingham or weavers of Lancashire, but are compelled to exchange with the protected manufacturers of their own country, who in some cases do not give half what the farmers could get from the Lancashire or Birmingham manufacturers. Bright said he had no wish to reproach Americans, who some day he believed would discover the right course. He felt sanguine there would be a gradual movement in America in the right direction.
The time would come when England and America, although two nations, would be one people and one in commerce. Bright strongly denounced resort to arms as a means of settling international controversies. He then pointed out that during Queen Victoria's reign the wars in which England had been engaged had cost the nation £150,000,000 and the lives of 68,000 men. He deprecated further annexation of territory by Great Britain.

Chamberlain, in the course of his speech, said when the work of mercy of relieving British garrisons in the Sudan was happily ended, the English would abandon that country and let the Soudanese establish the form of government they liked best. He said he hoped the present parliament would settle the Brazilian deadlock, and concluded by denouncing the present English land system as exceptionally unjust, unfair and ridiculous. When Chamberlain mentioned the name of Parnell it was received with loud groans and hisses.
Mr. Bright declared that if the project of colonial federation was persisted in it would be found to result in the loss of Canada.

FIGHT WITH MUTINEERS.
SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 29.—The *Bullfinch's* New York special says: The Swedish brigantine *Natal* arrived yesterday, having sailed from Boston for Brisbane and Queensland. On the outward trip a terrible mutiny occurred. The mutineers killed Captain Enstrom's son. The captain, having no leg irons or handcuffs, shot two of the ringleaders and threw their bodies overboard. The details of the story are horrible.

A later dispatch gives the following particulars of the mutiny on the brigantine *Natal*: When two months out the captain was attacked in his berth at night by the carpenter, armed with a broad ax, but aided by the mate he beat off his assailant, who was joined by the steward, also armed. The captain staunchly his wounds, and he and the mate armed themselves with a gun and a revolver and sallied out, where they were met by the carpenter, steward and three sailors, armed with axes, sheath knives and capstan bars. In the struggle the captain's pistol was captured, and the mate was shot under the right eye and in the chin. The captain received numerous wounds and slashes from sheath knives. The mutineers retreated into the forehold, where they were all imprisoned, as was supposed, by the battering down of the hatches. The captain and the mate took in the topsails and outer jibs, and then searched for the second mate, who was the captain's son. They found his cap, gashed and bloody. He had been murdered and thrown overboard. Suddenly they discovered the carpenter skulking behind the captain and he was overpowered and tied. The captain and the mate worked the vessel for four days, and then located the fore hatch and called on the mutineers to come up, disarm and surrender. They tumbled up, threw their sheath knives on the deck, and muttered that their pistols had been lost below. The captain had no leg irons or handcuffs with which to secure them, and as he believed they lied, he shot the carpenter and the steward dead, and threw their bodies overboard. Rufus and Tonton, the two seamen, agreed to obey orders after that.

OTTAWA, Jan. 27.—The government has decided to take a census of the northwest territories, with a view of giving them representatives in parliament.

EXECUTIVE SESSION OF THE SENATE.
The senate went into executive session at 12:30 on the 29th, and the suspended vote of last night upon Vance's motion to postpone action upon the Nicaraguan treaty was considered, resulting in the defeat of the motion, 22 to 25.
Sherman's amendment, looking to abrogation or modification of the Clayton-Bulwer treaty was then discussed some hours, and coming to a vote in committee of the whole, was defeated 27 to 28. The second Sherman amendment, relating to discriminations in the tolls, was defeated without division.
The treaty was then reported to the senate, and a vote upon Sherman's amendment in relation to the Clayton-Bulwer treaty was again up, resulting in its adoption, 30 to 19.
A vote was then taken upon the treaty itself, and 32 senators voted for its ratification, while 23 voted against it. The affirmative being less than two-thirds of the whole number voting, the treaty was not ratified.—Jan. 29.

Bad Reports From Panama.
New York, Jan. 29.—The *Post's* Washington dispatches gives startling information concerning mortality among the line of the Panama canal. There seems to be no doubt about the authenticity of the statements. The director general of the canal company has lost his entire family by yellow fever, and is himself the only survivor of a party of twelve persons who arrived at the isthmus some fifteen months ago. The annual death rate is put down at eleven in every one hundred. The disease seems to be yellow fever in nearly every case. The sender of this information reasonably concludes that the isthmus is pestilential, and in doing so merely confirms the view of previous observers. The building of a canal through such a country can be scarcely less costly in human life than a bloody war.

The Transcontinental.
BOSTON, Jan. 29.—Elijah Smith, president of the Oregon Transcontinental railway, was seen to-day in relation to the published statement that his road had a large and losing interest in the Oregon & California system. "The only interest," said Smith, "that the Oregon Transcontinental company has in the Oregon & California is this, we are creditors to the amount of \$140,000, due January 1st, but not paid. If the Oregon & California had paid that, we would have delivered to them \$2,200,000 of their second mortgage bonds, which we own. As it is, the Oregon & Transcontinental still holds the bonds and is secured against loss."

Stewart's Condition.
LONDON, Jan. 29.—General Wolsley telegraphed from Korti this morning that he received reports from the surgeons at Kabut, stating that General Stewart was doing well. No attempt has been made to extract the bullet, which entered his thigh and is now lodged in the region of the groin. A hospital for the wounded and disabled of Stewart's command has been pitched on the bank of the Nile.
