**SHARP CRITICISM ON MAINE FOLKS.**  
The men here never close a door, a sure indication of long residence in saw-mills. In all dining rooms there is the ever-present odor of fried cod fish or mackerel. The Equinam eats his seal grease raw; the native of Maine burns his bear grease and cooks his victuals in it, thus producing an odor which is never forgotten. A crowded railroad car has the stench of the kitchen. The social habits are queer. Profanity seems to be the rule in conversation. I have heard more profane swearing here in two days than I heard in Leadville in two weeks. I now realize the force of the remark that extremes meet.  
The habits and peculiarities of the extreme south and extreme north of the Union are the same. These extremes cannot meet because the great conservative population of the middle states is between them, but they can stand at a distance and yell, "You're another!" over the gulf which separates them. The bigoted southerner is not a whit worse than the bigoted New Englander. The ruling classes of New England do not have to kill the working classes to control their suffrages; they "influence" them in the same way that a southern man once told me he influenced the votes of his negroes—"they make it a question of meat and bread."  
The strong point with the New Englander is his religion, and here again is like the extreme southerner. Religion and morals are different qualities. They will fight like hell for their religious belief, but each man's morals are his private affair. He can practice what he pleases if he only believes right, but mainly he must believe in some style of religion, and as communities fall into the groove they generally adopt the same creed, and while they advocate liberty of conscience, with them it means liberty to believe as they do. Down south a man can be anything he likes in politics if he votes as the people of the neighborhood do. Up here a man can be anything in morals if he is only a professor of some kind of religious belief.  
Physically the New England people do not differ from those of the west more than might be expected in comparing a well-fed population with one that has had to rough it on fish, bear, and granite. The men are average good looking. I can now understand why the women of this section want a law prohibiting the sale of liquor and the suppression of such places as might offer some diversion to the men. If there is no other place to go and nothing else to look at, then the men are forced to stay at home and look at the women. Perhaps these women make up in other qualities what they lack in looks. If they don't, Lord pity the poor devils who cannot get away from the stone-quarry state!

**RELIGIOUS FANATICS.**  
At Creston, Iowa, there are a large number of the sect known as Adventists. There are a number of families of them and they are very devout. In the town of Creston lives the Karl family, consisting of twelve members. The Karls stand well and several of the men are railroaders, but most intense believers in the faith. They fully believed that the world would close upon January 4th and made all arrangements to that end, having clothing made and on the morning of the 4th donned funeral habiliments and spent the day praying, singing and reading the Bible and waiting for the crash. They refused to leave the house or eat or prepare anything to eat. The crash didn't come, but they believed it would and remained ready to receive it in the bedroom. They now believe a sacrifice is necessary; that their God demands a ransom, and made arrangements to offer up a daughter, a girl about sixteen, Katie Karl, as an offering to their God, who is angry and will not carry out his desires until the girl, or some other pure and sinless human being is killed. The neighbors made complaint, but nothing could be done. Policemen are stationed about the house to prevent the cold-blooded murder of the girl which is feared, as several attempts to knife her have been made by the father. The men won't work, nor will they permit the women to, and the entire sect, fully fifty, are almost starved to death from watching, waiting and fasting. They are about dead, and cannot hold out many days. The people are greatly worked up about such carryings on and an effort will be made to stop them.

**THE CLAYTON-BULWER TREATY.**  
WASHINGTON, Feb. 3.—There is in many minds a desire to know why the Clayton-Bulwer treaty was ever negotiated, if, as now appears from so many quarters, there is a demand for its modification or its annulment. "To understand it fully," said a prominent man in public life, "it is necessary to recur to the condition of affairs in Central America and on the isthmus of Panama at that period. Coval with our conquest of territory from Mexico, Mr. Buchanan, who was secretary of state under Mr. Polk's administration, concluded a treaty with New Granada, now known as the United States of Colombia, in regard to the rights of the United States at the isthmus. It is commonly known as the Bidlac treaty, from the name of the minister who negotiated it. The English were jealous of this treaty as foreshadowing a fixed determination on the part of our government to acquire territory in Central America. At the same time England was pushing from the Mosquito coast and British Honduras, and threatening the acquisition of large portions of Central America. It was at this time, too, that the south was under full headway of territorial acquisition, stimulated by the splendid acquisition of New Mexico."  
A Pittsburg Sensation.

**PITTSBURG, Feb. 3.**—An afternoon paper publishes a long article going to show there is a smoldering volcano ready to break forth at any moment in this city of socialists, in large numbers and supplied with explosives. It says two men famous all over the country, and millionaires, have furnished large sums of money to socialists. The movement is against mill owners and other capitalists, several of whom have been warned. In the movement are German, Russian, Italian, Swedish, Swiss and French socialists, and Irish dynamiters. Heavy English interests can be reached here by Irish dynamiters. Thousands of men now idle are emboldened by the successful London explosions. The paper adds: "This sounds sensational, but it is true and known to be true by persons with interests at stake." The article has created the greatest excitement among all classes of people.

**LONDON, Feb. 3.**—Advices from Hong Kong state that only three French vessels are now engaged in the blockade of the southeast coast of Formosa. The French are destroying hundreds of fishing and trading crafts, killing crews or sending them to Kelung. The inhabitants of Hong Kong are indignant that such operations will be allowed.  
New York, Feb. 3.—Among the World's city gossip is the following: "Not less than three gentlemen during the current week have spoken in a merely incidental way of the personal danger which they conceive surrounds President-elect Cleveland. One was General Edward M. McCook, and another was Postmaster General James, both Republicans."

**CAIRO, Feb. 3.**—Major Chetwode has arrived here. The Arabs made an attack upon the convoy sent to Kassala and a stubborn fight ensued, resulting in the repulse of the Arabs, who left 500 dead upon the field. The convoy lost fifty men killed. Five thousand troops will be sent to relieve the garrisons at Golanot and Meerah.  
**PARIS, Feb. 3.**—Admiral Courbet telegraphed the war office to-day that the French forces, after a severe fight carried the Chinese works commanding the Kelung mines. He states that the French troops lost 9 killed and 53 wounded during the engagement. The Chinese loss was heavy.  
**PARIS, Feb. 3.**—Advices here state that Generals De Lisle and Negrier are advancing upon Langson from different directions, each in command of a column of 6,000 troops.  
**PARIS, Feb. 3.**—It is reported here that two well-known German officers and one Frenchman were among the killed on the Mahdi's side at the recent battle in the Soudan.

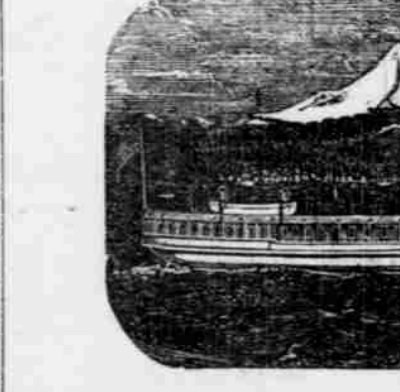
