



True Source of the Mississippi.

This has long been a vexed question, and in June, 1881. to Lake Itasea, and, accompanied by an old Indian guide, pushed forward to the south; and the Captain was rewarded by the discovery of another lake of considerable size, which proved to be, without a shadow of a doubt, the true source of the Mississippi. It is in latitude 47° 13° 25°, and the lake is three feet above Lake Itasea, the hitherto supposed source of the river. The Mississippi may, therefore, be said to originate in an altidata for a basis, may be placed at 3, or one dollar 184 miles. The tract of country in which the river originates is a remote and unfrequented region.


