The canning of salmon on the Columbia river is as perfect as any process of the kind in the world-The salmon after canning is subjected to so many tests before being finally boxed up for shipment that the percentage of improperly cooked or sealed cans, is reduced to the lowest possible minimum. The few tins that may escape the packer manifest their unwelcome presence long before the salmon has been placed in market. It may be asserted without fear of successful contradiction that if a can of salmon is thoroughly cooked and perfectly sealed its contents will remain unaltered as long as the metal casing remains intact.






