WOMAN SUFFRAGE.

A visonous effort in behalf of womsession of the legislature. The ad- a salary of \$10,000 a year. vocates of the measure argue that the legislature can grant the suffrage right to women, if it sees fit so to do, by direct legislation. The opponents of the movement say that the fact that the proposed constitutional amendment was overwhelmingly beaten last June is sufficient argument against immediate consideration of the measure.

The judiciary committee of the state senate has been listening to addresses from different advocates, finally reporting back the bill without recommendation.

The argument that the advocates of the measure make at this time is substantially this: All power in this state is vested in the legislative assembly, except such as is prohibited to it in the constitution of the United States or this state. The state constitution contains this provision: "In all elections not otherwise provided for by this constitution, every white male citizen of the United States of the age of twenty-one years and upwards who shall have resided in the state during the six months immediately proceding such election, and every white male of foreign birth upwards who shall have resided in the state six months immediately preceding such election, and shall have declared his intention of becoming a citizen of the United States one year preceding such election, conformably to the laws of the United States on the subject of naturalization, shall be entitled to vote at all elections an thorized by law."

This is the only clause in the constitution conferring upon any class the right to vote. Section 3, article II., says that "no idiot or insane person shall be entitled to the privilege of an elector," and Sec. 6, same artiof an elector, and Sec. 6, same arti-cle, says that "no negro, Chinaman or First Class in Every Respect mulatto shall have the right of suffrage." Now if women are ignored both in the recital of those who are endowed with and those who are disbarred from the right of franchise, it is argued with great show of reason that the reserve power of legislation where it does not conflict with constitutional provision gives the legislature authority to confer upon the women of Oregon the right of suffrage. Justice spagests the conferring of such right.


