The legislature adjourns to-morrow night—a very sensible proceeding.

Owing to colonial annexations during the past year, Germans, like Britons, are now able to say that the sun never sets in the German empire.

DYNAMITE has recently been put to the odd use of slaughtering cattle at Islington near London, by fastening a small charge between the horns.

A FORTY thousand dollar hotel which in 1864 adorned the now deserted oil town of Pithole, in Pennsylvania, has just been sold for kindling wood.

The dynamite devilishness has reached this coast. A Whatecom, W. T., dispatch of the 17th, reports that on the previous evening a house in that burg was blown to atoms by dynamite.

The Canada Pacific Company, it is reported, want the dominion government to buy back all their unsold land at \$2 an acre, and there are indications that the government intend doing so.

The canvass who has arrived at Korti and claim to be an eye witness of Gordon's death, said Gordon was making for a powder magazine intending to perish by blowing up the town. The rebels foreseeing his purpose shot him.

INSTEAD of adding any more amendments to the present federal constitution, the Boston Herald thinks it would be better to celebrate the centenary adoption of the instrument by calling a convention to revise it.

IN Des Moines, Iowa, the number of saloons has increased from 60 to 102 since the so-called "prohibition" went into effect. As these sellers have no license to pay, they can stand an occasional confiscation of stock, which is kept low in expectation of such emergencies.

OF the total distance of the Canadian Pacific railway (2,550 miles) the road is graded for 2,294 miles, and rails are laid for 2,070 miles. The total distance ballasted is 1,880 miles. The total amount of cash subsidy paid by the government to the company to December 31st was \$19,773,037, out of the total of \$25,000,000 subsidy.

AT Lincoln's second inauguration 119 armed men were sworn in. At the coming one it is intended to have 500. At Grant's second inauguration windows on Pennsylvania avenue, to view the procession, cost from \$25 to \$50; the prices asked for those offered for use at this inauguration range from \$20 to \$80, and one man has a single window facing the avenue for which he expects to get \$200 from sight seers.

FROM the record of the inundations which have for ages been the scourge of Holland, it would appear that during the last thirteen centuries one of the larger floods has occurred on an average once in seven years. About six hundred years ago the sea broke through its restraining dikes and eighty thousand persons are said to have perished. In a single night, in 1421, seventy-two villages and one hundred thousand human beings were swept away.

THE great dynamite explosion in the house of commons demonstrated the fact that under existing rules governing the admission of strangers and lobbyists of the house of parliament, it will be an easy matter for the dynamiters to convey explosives into the building during a session of parliament and cause the death of many of its members. The government has decided to adopt more stringent rules regarding admission of visitors, and members of parliament in future will not be allowed to introduce strangers in the galleries and lobbies.

SWITZERLAND is a spunky little republic and doesn't propose to have any dynamite outrages in her borders, while she opens her arms to fugitives from all over Europe, so long as they behave themselves. A few days ago a threat was made to destroy the federal palace and the council at Berne, unless that body should enact certain legislation bearing on anarchists. The communication was received by the council when in session, and in twenty minutes a joint resolution was passed commanding the officers of the law throughout the republic to expel from Swiss soil every man and woman fairly shown to be an anarchist, and ten men have already been escorted to the border.

HENRY VILLARD is said to have resigned the presidency of the O. & C. railroad, because he found that his executed plan for paying the January coupons on the first mortgage bonds could not be equitably carried out, and because default of the interest would involve the company with the Oregon and Transcontinental, which he had organized. In this involvement he was unwilling to be engaged in any manner. The English and German bond and stock holders were unwilling to accept his resignation, and urged him to reconsider it, but he would not.
