Fall River, Mass., roughs took the Salvation Army at its word, with a volley of stones, disabling several women and fatally injuring one.

J. F. de la Plaine, formerly secretary of the United States Legation at Vienna, left the bulk of his large estate to found a home for the friendless in New York.
