FOREIGN DISPATCHES.

War Between England and Russia Now Probable.

LONDON, March 11.—Financial circles are excited over official reports received this afternoon confirming the report published in the Times this morning to the effect that Russian troops have advanced still further into Afghan territory. The Russian government admits such movement has taken place, but asserts it was only intended for the purpose of seeking a more suitable position in case of war with Afghanistan. It is generally believed that both Afghans and Russians are hurrying forward and a collision is imminent. British consuls have fallen eleven-sixty deaths of 1 per cent, and Russia securities 2 per cent in consequence of the above news. Prices on all the continental bourses have fallen, in sympathy with the London stock exchange. The principal declines are among Russian and Egyptian securities.

War rumors produced an excitement on the stock exchange which amounted during the afternoon to a state of semi-panic.

Rumors of war with Russia, and expectation of large deliveries of stock at the conclusion of the settlement tomorrow, together with a general disinclination to buy stocks of any sort under present circumstances, completely demoralized the market today. Exceptional cases were American and Canadian railway securities. Prices have fallen heavily on all sides. Consols show a decline of 5/8 to 11/16 since yesterday evening. Russian securities are 1/2 lower, Egyptian securities 1/4 lower, and other countries a fraction lower. Chilean and Brazilian stocks receded respectively 3/4 and 2, owing to rumors of political troubles in those countries.

The panic abated somewhat after the close of the market, owing to the statement that Childers, chancellor of the exchequer, announced in the commons that no news of a Russian advance in Afghanistan had been received by the government, and that he did not believe an advance had been made. Dealings continued long after the official close. Many orders to sell were received from Berlin and Frankfurt. It is reported that financial agents of the Russian minister of foreign affairs have made overtures to the Rothschilds and Barings to join the German bankers the Mendelssohns in placing a new Russian loan. These proposals, it is said, were refused.

LONDON, March 11.—A dispatch from Kushan says: It is reported that the Russian government has ordered two regiments from Elizabethopol to Askabad. Russia is making active preparations to complete the Kizilartad and Askabad railway. Four thousand Russian troops were reported at Tiflis a fortnight ago for Askabad.

Measures are being taken to increase the number of reserves of the native army. The Indian government will probably recommend a permanent force of 15,000 English and 3,000 native soldiers for the English garrisons.

Officials at the Russian embassy deny that any preparations for war are being made by Russia on the Afghan frontier. There is only the usual number of troops in southern Turkistan, and no movement is being made toward sending reinforcement there.

LONDON, March 11.—Childers, chancellor of the exchequer, stated in the house of commons this evening that the government is informed of any further advance of Russians or Afghans, nor did he believe such advance would be made.

New York, March 11.—"I look forward to lively business in Columbia river salmon this season," said Fish Commissioner Blackford this morning to a reporter, "principally on account of competition between the Union and Northern Pacific railroads and also because of the low freight rates prevailing. The first consignment of chinook salmon came in yesterday. They sell at fifteen cents wholesale and twenty-five to thirty cents retail, and are delicious in quality. We propose, at the April trout display, to make a special exhibit of every variety of salmon and trout of the Pacific coast. Gentlemen in Washington territory and Oregon have promised to send us a number of fine specimens."

THE Terms of Occupation.

BERLIN, March 11.—The result of Count Herbert Bismarck's special mission to England, relative to German interests in west Africa, is reported as follows: England Concedes to Germany the whole of the Cameroons country, with the exception of the mission town of Victoria, where the Germans are alleged to have handed down the British flag. England further agrees not to interfere with any action Germany take in the country from the south bank of the Rio Del Rey, a small river emptying into the Biafra, some distance north of Cameroons, to the equator. Germany enters the basin of the lower Niger.

DEBILIS, March 11.—Parnell has issued a manifesto advising the municipalities of Ireland to observe a respectful neutrality regarding the approaching visit of the Prince of Wales.

LONDON, March 11.—The Telegraph states that the English government rejects the offer of the United States to negotiate a convention with the British West Indies.

HONO KONA, March 11.—The French, after five days' fighting, carried the Chinese positions around Kelung. Forty Frenchmen were killed and 200 wounded.
