MAIL bags from Cincinnati were recently delivered in Berlin in the short space of eleven days.

One of the curious things discovered by the publication of Thomas Jefferson's diary is that he paid in one year \$109 for washing and \$1,638.94 for wine.

OSMAN DIGNA says El Mahdi intends to restore the whole Nile valley, from source to mouth, to Mohammedan control, and after he has taken Cairo he will send envoys to Constantinople, inviting the sultan to form an alliance with him against all Christians.

EDWARD ATKINSON of Boston, who is a recognized authority in matters of statistics, has been calculating the total value of the annual product of our silver mines, and he finds that it is not equal to the value of the annual production of hens' eggs in the United States.

PROFESSOR PROCTOR believes that at least two of the planets, Venus and Mars, have atmospheres like our own, that they have seas, lakes, rivers and continents and that they are inhabited—probably by people not much different from those on this earth. Jupiter and Saturn he believes are peopled by races bearing no resemblance to those on this planet.

LAST Thursday, talking of appointments, Cleveland said: "Appointments will be made only at places become vacant, and vacancies will occur only by expiration of the term for which the present holder was appointed, or by removal, which in every case will be for good cause, to be proved by the presentation of charges and specifications backed by evidence such as would be accepted in a court of law. When appointments are to be made, Democrats will, of course, be selected. As to removals for cause it is undoubtedly safe to say that those public officers who have made notorious use of their places for partisan purposes will be the first to go. The new administration will hasten to restore them to private life as soon as charges against them are proved, and to appoint their Democratic successors."

The women suffrage association of Massachusetts has discussed the proposition that the dogma incorporated in the religious creeds derived from Judaism, teaching that woman was an after thought in creation, her sex a misfortune, marriage a subordination, and maternity a curse, are contrary to the law of God as revealed in nature and the precepts of Christ. One debater excoriated Judaism from responsibility for the degradation of women. A minister followed suit, and also defended early Christianity, and an Episcopalian layman declared that until the church, Catholic, Episcopal, or Methodist, recognized the right of women to be bishops and to ordain others to the ministry, the work of equality can never be accomplished. This last speaker had found the pulpit center of opposition to woman suffrage, and later it was arraigned as a stumbling block in the way of temperance; but finally Mrs. Elizabeth Cady Stanton declared that "every form of religion that has breathed upon this earth has degraded woman," an opinion in which she will find few to agree with her.

Three generations of Bayards figure in American political history. James A. Bayard was a warm friend and supporter of Alexander Hamilton and was a member of the house of representatives when the memorable campaign of 1800 between Thomas Jefferson and Aaron Burr threw the election of a president into the hands of the Assembly. He was elected senator in 1801 and one of the commissioners to negotiate peace with Great Britain in 1813. The father of Thomas F., also named James A. Bayard, served continuously in the United States senate from 1851 to 1864, when he resigned. He and his son Thomas, were elected on the same day, January 10th, 1869, by the same legislature to the United States senate, the father to fill the unexpired term of George Riddle and the son to the full term succeeding it, the

only instance in the nation's history of a like character. Thos. F. Bayard was born in October, 1823, and is in his fifty-seventh year. He is a lawyer by education and is a recognized authority on constitutional law. Yet there has been nothing brilliant in Bayard's legal or political career. He has been simply painstaking and laborious. His position at the outbreak of the rebellion and his strong sympathy with the south has done much to damage him politically, while his lack of strongly marked character has created distrust of him among his associates. There has never been any question of his honor or his honesty during his long service in the senate, but no one will look to him for a spirited foreign policy, as he lacks the qualities which are needed for such a line of action as conspicuously as Frelinghuysen lacks them.

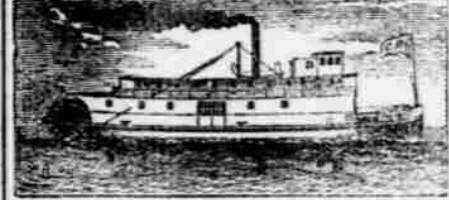

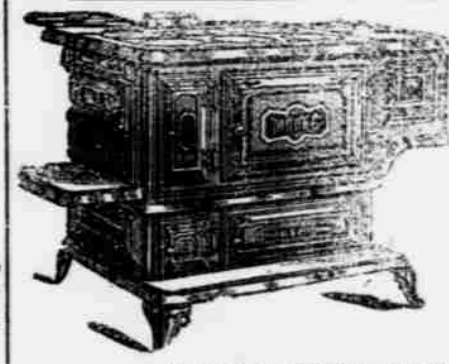

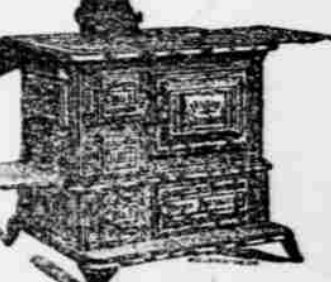
