AN EXHORTER IN GREAT TROUBLE.

The following account is given of the origin of the term "cave-dropper." 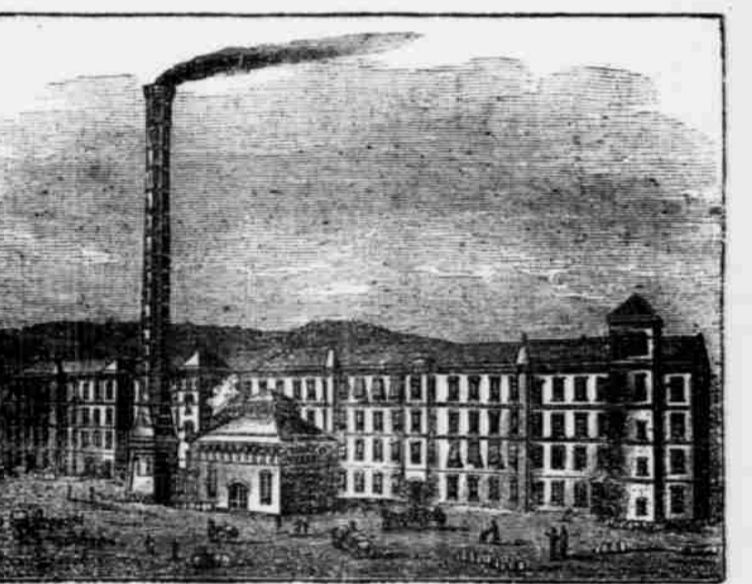
