

A Work of Art.

A Work of Art.

One of the nearest and most elaborately finished Writing Desks ever seen on this coast can be seen on exhibition in the window of the cigar store, a xt to Foster's Exchange, on Water street in this city. The desk was made by Mr. C. Constantine of this city and certainly reflects great credit in the skill, taste and workmanship of the manufacturer. The desk is about fifty-two inches high by two feet in width and is made out of various woods such as eak, ast, butternut, wainut and white holly: they were first sawed out in pleces and so cut in beantiful designs as to resemble fine bracket work. The top or cover of the cesk is inlaid with cardinal and blue velvet. At the back on either side of a square recess are two handsomely carved apartments with folding doors. In the desk part are a number of pigeon holes for papers, envelopes, etc., this is surmounted with beautiful bracket work, and on the top of each side is a white door, handsomely carved; underneath is a semi circle, also carved in rich designs, inlaid with gilt work. The sides are inlaid with crimson velvet, the bracket work being laid over it in different kinds of rich woods, the whole being surmounted with gold mouldings. A brief description of this wonderful invention conveys no idea of its elegance and finish, one must see it to appreciate it. 
