WINNIPEG, March 31.-The rebelln started by Riel has gained greater dimensions by the rising of Indians in sympathy. News came from Quappelle to-day that Indians on the reserves on the File hills had risen in arms and killed the farm instructor there, numbering in all about 500. Three companies of rifles and por-tions of a field battery went from Quappelle station to Fort Quappelle. No advices have been received from

The Free Press has received the following from Battleford: We are in imminent dangers from the Indians in the vicinity. Chief Poundmaker has gone into open rebellion, and put the instructor and agent at defiance. Indians have left other reserves, and are concentrating in large numbers about Battleford. It is estimated that there are at least 500 Indians, and more are coming there in a short time. Several of them have come into twen the extension to have it and into town, threatening to burn it and take possession of the barracks and stores. All the women and children have been hurried into the barracks, and everything is being done to put the barracks in the best possible condition for defense to protect the help-less. All the men have been enrolled for service, and arms and ammunition issued them. We will be able to raise a force of fully 200 men for defense. Several houses in town were broken into last night and rifled. The few half-breeds who live about town have gone to the hills, ostensibly to be out of the way, but it is pretty certain they will join the Indians and incite them to violence, when the worst is feared. The Indians will not remain long inactive, and may descend on the town at any moment, and seize all stores to provide themselves with provisions. There will likely have provided to the control of selves with provisions. There will likely be a general powwow of Indians to-morrow, when they will make demands. It is known that the whites will protect their lives and property to the last, but ewing to superior numbers of Indians the position is most critical. Nearly all the police have been withdrawn to Prince Albert, and the supply of errors is live. Mill Feed, Etc

Albert, and the supply of arms is limited here. We hope for the best."
No word has been received at Win nipeg from Riel's vicinity, or from Prince Albert. Operations cannot be undertaken by troops until a force arrives from the east. Volunteer battalions are rapidly enrolling here


