PROGRESS OF THE TEHUANTEPEC SHIP RAILWAY.

The government of Mexico has late-ly made important additions to the concessions heretofore granted to the Tenuantepec ship railway. There are several other minor concessions granted, such as the right to establish two tow-boat lines independent of taxation and to collect harbor dues.
