YESTERDAY'S London Daily Telegraph publishes a dispatch from Berlin, stating that Russia refuses to yield an inch of the territory she has occupied on the Afghan frontier.

It is stated on the authority of a naval officer at Washington that the Russian minister to the United States has endeavored to secure the services of a naval officer there in purchasing a number of small vessels used between San Francisco and the Sandwich Islands in transporting sugar.

GENERAL STEPHENSON, commanding the British forces on the Nile above Cairo, reports to the government that it will be practically impossible to move the British troops from Dongola during the summer, because they will have to proceed so slowly.

Le Nord, the most rabid pro-Russian newspaper in Belgium, now predicts war between Russia and England. Le Nord is regarded as the semi-official organ of the Russian government, and this article is believed to have been inspired.

THE N. Y. Tribune says: At a meeting of the executive committee of the Oregon Railway and Navigation company it was agreed that the declaration of the usual quarterly dividend should be postponed one month in consequence of the loss of business in January by snowstorms.

An order for six fast iron cruisers of the Esmeralda pattern, was received in Philadelphia last Thursday. These vessels are nominally ordered by private gentlemen just as they might order a steam yacht, but they will be for sale when completed, and the offers of only one European government will be entertained, and it is thought that government will be Russia.

A COMMITTEE appointed at a meeting of representative Democrats of the territories waited upon the president last Saturday, and presented a series of resolutions, earnestly requesting him at his earliest convenience to look into the political and administrative condition of the territories.
