THE SOUDAN. Does anybody remember that there was once a gallant Christian soldier named Gordon, who was treacherously murdered by Arabs at a place called Khartoum? There was an impression that a British army under the great soldier of the age, Lord Wolseley—the man who declared that "Mr. Grant would soon be forgotten, while General Lee would live forever—was dispatched to Egypt to rescue Gordon, or at least to avenge his death. We have a faint recollection of the departure of certain English regiments for the battle-fields of the Sudan, the guards, among others, around whose brawny necks the fairest of the London girls hung weeping as the band played martial airs and the men went forth to die for their country. Has anybody any idea what has become of this army and of the great work it was sent to accomplish?

At latest dates Lord Wolseley, under a large sun umbrella, was traveling leisurely down the Nile toward Cairo, where Mr. Shepherd's successor keeps a capital hotel with "b. and s." always on ice. His army was encamped near Korti, with the sun at 130 degrees at midday, and delugingly cool nights, with a thermometer at 102 degrees. The mortality was not excessive. The doctors said that if the army were moved by the fall fully half of them would be alive. There was another British army which landed at Suakin and was going to march to Berber and lay a railroad forty several times and won victories every time, but it is noticed after every victory it always falls back whence it started. The railway is not selling through tickets to Berber as yet.

The very latest piece of news from the Sudan is that Wolseley, "with half his army," has been ordered to prepare to move to India. The question suggests itself, Which half? It can't be the half which the doctors say are laying their bones under the calcined sands of the desert; and yet, if the surviving half is meant, how is it to be got out of its present trap? If the army from Suakin can't get out, will El Mahdi be forbearing enough to let the Englishmen escape the way they came. It is a wretched business and reflects deep disgrace on England, on Mr. Gladstone and on General Wolseley. Never before in all England's history, was a gallant soldier sent forth on a mission of peace and good will and massed by savages without at least some effort to avenge his death. Never before was Great Britain so short of military talent that she was forced to trust the flower of her army to a man whose highest conception of the business of a soldier is the packing of a knapsack and the fastening of a gaiter. We had, Heaven knows, at the beginning of the war some wretched pretenders in the rank of general, but we never had a man so unfit as Wolseley, nor did we ever, in our darkest hours, leave an American soldier to be murdered in cold blood, or get a body of our choicest troops into a scrape from which nothing but extraordinary forbearance on the part of the enemy can extricate them.
