SPRING FEVER

LOOKS VERY WARLIKE.

England and Russia Apparently Determined to Fight.

London, April 22.—That the government expects war seems to be fairly inferred from the following reasons: First, its last night's proclamation of the probable evacuation of the Soudan; second, the reported refusal of the necessity of holding all troops there in readiness for service whenever they may be wanted, and these words were observed to be spoken with emphasis; third, the demand for £11,000,000, meaning a five and a half pence increase in the pound in taxes, a demand never before made except for war; fourth, the government would not have excited popular feeling by so readily giving vent to Lumsden's belligerent dispatch.

This morning's press spares no words in accepting Lumsden's report and giving the lie to Komaroff's testimony. This sentence from the *Chronicle*, heretofore a peaceful liberal paper, is a good instance of the defiant tone of the press: "A more crushing rejoinder could hardly be imagined. Not one sentence of Komaroff's report remains. Not one clause of it was exempt from the grossest and most impudent perversion of truth."

Troops are swarming to all barracks throughout the United Kingdom, in response to the government's call for the reserves. The war office in London is besieged by military officers asking for employment.

It has been decided to divide the Portsmouth fleet up into channel flying and reserve squadrons.

Fresh orders have been received to increase the number of workmen at Portsmouth.

The press association asserts that it is enabled to state that further communications have been received from St. Petersburg to the effect that the Russian government has refused to hold further inquiry in regard to General Komaroff's report of the engagement of March 30. It is the opinion, therefore, in English and Russian diplomatic circles, that peace cannot be maintained.

ODessa, April 22.—English merchants are closing out their business and preparing to leave the country. The excitement is increasing, and funds are falling.

St. Petersburg, April 22.—Every one is speaking of war as inevitable.

The Russian reply sent to M. Degiers, through Sir Edward Thornton yesterday, after the receipt of Sir Peter Lumsden's supplementary report on the battle of March 30, has just been received. M. Degiers replies curtly that Russia declines to enter upon any further discussion of the Penjdeh incident.

PARIS, April 22.—The *Journal des Debats* says this morning in regard to Gladstone's statement evoking responsibility for the suppression of the *Bosphore Egyptian*, that "France must look to England for redress. We will maintain our rights, and do not lack ample means to do so." It also stated that a French fleet has been got in readiness for the purpose of making a usual demonstration on Alexandria, to enforce compliance with the demand of France for retaliation for the suppression of the newspaper *Bosphore Egyptian*.

Particulars of Barrios' Death.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 22.—News received to-day by the steamer *Granada* from Panama, states that President Barrios met his death at the hands of a sharpshooter who was concealed in a tree near the advance forces of the Salvador troops. Some of the latter made a rush forward, to obtain possession of the body, and a terrible hand-to-hand conflict ensued, in which Barrios' son, Vinancio, and his son-in-law were killed. Mrs. Barrios who, with seven children, arrived here on the steamer, when asked by the government regarding the erection of a monument to her husband, replied: "The best monument the government could raise would be a man who is equal to the present occasion, and who would carry out the plans of Barrios." His remains were placed in a public cemetery. The funeral was attended by all the citizens and soldiers who were in the city of Guatemala at the time.

LONDON, April 22.—Dispatches received here this afternoon state that a terrible volcanic eruption has occurred in Passarvan, a province in the east end of the island of Java. A number of plantations have been devastated, and it is feared that fully 100 persons have been killed.
