That no minor, under the a of eigheten years, shall be permitted go abroad or be allowed to remain any theater or place of amusement which intoxicating liquors are sold, in any dance-house, or wander abothe streets of the city after the hour nine o'clock at night, unless such mir shall have the permission of his or I guardian or parent, or shall be accopanied by such parent, or unless su minor shall have necessary busine upon such street or streets. Any min minor shall have necessary busin upon such street or streets. Any min who shall violate the provisions of tordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and upon convict thereof in the police court shall be puished by a fine of not less than one, a more than thirty dollars or by impronment in the city jail not to exceed a days.
