**UNCLE JEFF SNOW.**  
The Philosopher Takes a View of Oregon  
as She is to be Some Time.

"I ain't no prophet, but that's com-  
in' a time when Oregon is goin' ter  
wake up and grow like a bound purp  
on fried jackrabbit and sour milk,"  
remarked the old man as he shut the  
door in his dog's face and reached for  
his pipe.

"The center of the state ain't allus  
ter be up a creek twelve miles from  
the Columby. You may see the day,  
my son, when five hundred dollars  
won't be gouged out of every ship  
that wobbles up the river to tie up in  
Portland. The ships will be towed  
up free, give wharf rent fur nothin'  
and then not one cent a week go  
above Astory bag. Let a railroad  
once git down that from the Willam-  
etta valley and what will be hauled  
up the river ter feed the Portland  
mossbacks still hangin' to corner lots  
and the prices of '88."

"Wall, Sumpter, howdy? Shut  
the door and set around. How's

vote fur only Marion county poli-  
ticians to go to the legisla-  
ture fur ever an' ever. They  
will vote for the best man they  
know in Oregon, no matter if he lives  
in Yaquina or Oregon City. Folks  
will be ketchin' on to the idee that  
mebby our constitution makers  
knowed about es much about gov-  
ment a hundred years ago es the ship  
makers knowed 'bout a torpedo boat  
or a dynamite cannon. It allus  
seemed funny to me how men ken  
say the people run this country when  
nobody has a chance to say yes or no  
to any fool law a lot of slaverin'  
judes may git up, 'cep'in a govnor  
or some blamed thierin' jedge. Ef  
the people voted on the laws once in  
a while, you'd see some fearful jobs  
knocked cold.

"Mirandy, won't yer let go on yer  
blow 'bout that mortgage? I'll tend  
to the mortgage and feed the hogs too."

"Oregon wants more men, more  
money, more brains, more factories.  
The farmers of Oregon hev got to  
quit sendin' wheat out of the country

York prices on mill-sites, corner lots  
and big slabs er land and hog the  
water powers, by taxin' idle property
