FRENCH ICONOCLASTS.

The most curious feature of the obsequies of Victor Hugo—whose funeral is said to have been the most imposing that ever took place in France—was the fact that not a single priest was to be seen in the vast assemblage, and that before the poet's body was received at the Pantheon the edifice was secularized by the destruction of the cross which surmounted its main entrance. At early daybreak, a workman, by order of the government, deliberately waved off the arms of the cross, thus divesting it of its religious character. A similar mutilation would have been practiced on the great cross which surmounts the dome, but for its size and the impossibility of removing its fragments in the time allotted. The performance was in strict accordance with Victor Hugo's will, which declared that there should be no religious element in the celebration of his funeral.

Americans, whatever their opinions may be, will view this operation with the contempt which extravagance engenders. The late M. Hugo was a free-thinker. So are many prominent men in this country. But what is the good of following the example of the barbarous ages and testifying our faith by heaving in pieces the symbols of a religion which we may not appreciate, but which affords a good deal of comfort to millions of our fellow creatures throughout the world? We can hardly restrain our indignation at the brutal stupidity of the Goths who manifested their derision at the gods of Greece and Rome by destroying works of art which they were equally incapable of appreciating and of reproducing. We feel ashamed of the Frenchmen of the last century who celebrated their emancipation from priestly tyranny by defacing the noble cathedrals of the middle ages. Such performances seem to us childish—akin to the action of the child who breaks his pocket-knife because he has cut his finger with it. In suffering them M. Hugo's friends seem to have resolved to perpetuate those traits in his character which made him ridiculous instead of those which made him noble and grand. It is a pity. We are always ready to take the side of the stage or the drawing-room against ecclesiastical intolerance, but decency will not permit a wanton insult to the faith of millions to pass without rebuke. There are far more Frenchmen who venerate the crosses than there are who reject it. They may be wrong, but reject one, not the executors of the great poet, nor the government of Republican France, can be justified in borrowing an example from Attila and Alaric, and declaring by their acts that the national mausoleum of France was not fitted to receive Victor Hugo's body till it had been stripped of the emblem of Christianity.

The throne of the empress of Russia is completely covered with plates of gold, and contains 1,500 rubies and 8,000 turquoises, besides many other rare and costly gems. The throne of the czar, known as the diamond throne, is truly a marvel. It is generally conceded that Russia possesses more precious stones than any other nation, a majority of which were procured at the expense of blood. The jewels in the cathedral of Moscow alone are valued at \$12,000,000.

The object of this proposal is to construct the waters of Bakers Bay by a bulkhead of piles and rip rap, as follows: The bulkhead to be five feet from the center, capped with 4x15 inch plank doubled and breaking joints, well bolted to each pile, and faced on the outside with 3 inch plank thoroughly spiked.

The rip-rap work to be laid up smooth on the outer face, well packed against the bulkhead on both sides, not less than three feet thick at the top, and properly sloped. The work is about 3,500 feet long and six feet high.

Ordinance No. 791.

An ordinance concerning minors. The city of Astoria does ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. That no minor, under the age of eighteen years, shall be permitted to go abroad or be allowed to remain in any theater or place of amusement in which intoxicating liquors are sold, or in any dance-house, or wander about the streets of the city after the hour of nine o'clock at night, unless such minor shall have the permission of his or her guardian or parent, or shall be accompanied by such parent or guardian.

Any minor who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof in the police court shall be punished by a fine of not less than one, nor more than thirty dollars or by imprisonment in the city jail not to exceed ten days.
