### FRENCH ICONOCLASTS

The most curious feature of the ob-sequies of Victor Hugo-whose fun-eral is said to have been the most imposing that ever took place in France - was the fact that not a single priest was to be seen in the vast assemblage, and that before the poet's body was received at the Pantheon the edifice was secularized by the destruction of the cross which sur-mounted its main entrance. At early daybreak, a workman, by order of the government, deliberately sawed off the arms of the cross, thus divest-ing it of its religious character. A similar mutilation would have been practiced on the great cross which surmounts the dome, but for its size semblage, and that before the poet's practiced on the great cross which surmounts the dome, but for its size and the impossibility of removing its

fragments in the time allotted. The performance was in strict accordance with Victor Hugo's will, which declared that there should be no re-ligious element in the celebration of his funeral.


