For the protection of this port against the waters of Baker Bay by a bulkhead of piles and rip rap, as follows:
The piles to be driven five feet from center, capped with six inch plank doubled and breaking joints, well bolted to each pile, and faced on the outside with 3 inch plank thoroughly spiked.

The rip rap-work to be laid up smooth on the outer face, well packed against the bulkhead on both sides, not less than three feet thick at the top, and properly sloped. The work is about 300 feet long and six feet high.

The government reserves the right to reject any or all bids.
