A ROMANCE OF SLAVERY.

Thor, N. Y. June 6.—Linked with the life of Frederick McKinney, a colored man, who has just died at Amsterdam, in this state, is an interesting romance. Years ago he was a slave in the service of Oscar Bardwell, a Virginia planter. Bardwell had a daughter whose every wish was gratified until it came to the asking of her father's consent to her marriage with a young man of a neighboring and wealthy family. There had long been bitter feeling between the heads of each household, and time had not healed the breach. Bardwell, incensed at the thought of a union between his daughter and the son of his enemy, commanded the girl to renounce the young man. Unlike modern heroines, the girl, instead of leaving the parental roof, fleeing with her lover, yielded to her father's order. Not long after Miss Bardwell brought into her father's presence McKinney, the colored slave, and, with all the fire that a revenged act can inspire, exclaimed: "This is my husband."

Bardwell drove them from his house, and the comely white girl and her dark-skinned partner went out into the world. They settled in Troy several years ago and here met a negro who was also formerly one of Bardwell's slaves, and who furnished the details of the strange union of the two lives. They afterwards moved to Amsterdam, where in a pauper's cot in the county poorhouse, the once beautiful Miss Bardwell breathed her last at the age of 61 years. Although her death was a marriage of love, it is said that she acted through years of poverty and toil the part of a true wife to her husband, to whom she bore several children. McKinney died in a cheerless shanty in an alley. From the day they left the Virginia plantation they never heard from the rich father, and although often mentioned by want, never sought his assistance.

It is stated on good authority that the Chicago and Northwestern company is determined to push its Nebraska line through to a junction with the Central Pacific railroad, at some point in Utah, perhaps Corinne or Promontory. If this is so, it means a union of the Northwestern and Central Pacific to parallel the Union Pacific. The logging engineers have already reached a point in Wyoming near the headwaters of the Niobrara. Thence the line will push forward to the continental divide at Coal creek, following that stream to the North Platte and Stillwater, and so westward to a junction with the Central Pacific, as has been said. It is stated that the track will reach the Wyoming line this year. Should the Northwestern and Central Pacific form an alliance as a transcontinental competitor with the Union Pacific, it is very likely that the latter will spring away from its connection with the Central Pacific and strike out for the western ocean on its own line. (It has already done this by building the Oregon Short Line.) Now will the paralleling stop here? The Chicago, Milwaukie, St. Paul and the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy have occasional ambitions, and will not be content until their iron is rusted by the salt water of the Pacific ocean. The more competitive lines across the continent the better. The time is not far distant when the lumber of the Pacific coast will freely mingle with the pines of the country east of the Rockies, while the fruits of the Cascade division of the Northern Pacific construction department.
