Sea Lions Must Go.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 20.—A short time ago a committee, consisting of Dr. Harkness, president of the academy of sciences, Dr. Behr and Adolph Sutro, was appointed to devise means of checking the wholesale destruction of salmon and other fish by sea lions. Doctors Harkness and Behr agreed that the sea lions should be exterminated as far as possible. It was suggested that this might be accomplished by shooting the animals at Seal rock that have been admired so much by tourists, and also the animals on the Farallones, these two points being the breeding places for this part of the coast. As they do their fishing at night, and bask in the sun on the rocks during the day, it was thought there would be little difficulty in destroying vast numbers by killing as many females as possible, which would lead to a continual and bloody war among the superabundant males, the desired end would be accomplished. Fishermen claim that fully 400,000 pounds of fish per day are devoured in the harbor alone, one full grown sea lion eating and digesting 100 pounds every twenty-four hours. Sutro is opposed to the destruction of sea-lions, which constitute a magnificent attraction for tourists. The penal sum in the office bond of the city treasurer-elect of Chicago is placed at \$5,000,000.
