AN INTERESTING CASE.

In a matter of the settlement of certain road and franchise questions between B. Hutton and I. N. Henness, of Pacific county, the decision of their separate rights in the premises was left to a board of arbitration, consisting of Justices Griswold, Espy and Goulter who met last Wednesday to try the case, Mr. Hutton was rep-resented by Joseph A. Gill, and Mr. Henness by G. C. Fulton, both of Astoria. Hutton set forth as his claim that he with Alfred Baker and S. W. Embree, in 1879 agreed to give Henness the right of way over their land to build a road from Shoalwater bay to Ilwaco, and to have the exclusive privilege of hauling oysters and freight over the road for a term of five years, and at the expiration of that time Henness was to turn over the business to Hutton. Hutton also claimed that by the agreement for the lease of the road, Henness was to keep the road in good repair, and get all freight and ovsters through on time, which he did not do, as many complaints had come to Hutton of oysters failing to go through on time.
