Washington county has a population of 9,425. Everybody is going on an excursion to-day that hasn't already gone.

The Jennie Ward sailed from San Francisco for here last Friday, the 17th inst.

The regular meeting of the vestry of Grace church will be held to-morrow evening at eight o'clock.

The E. N. Cooke brought down 2,500 cases salmon from Brookfield to land on the Carronon Castle yesterday.

There will be a praise service at the Presbyterian church this evening by the choir, assisted by other good musical talent.

T. M. Le Berthon, general agent for L. P. McCarty's annual publication, is at the Occident.

The Clara Parker will go to Chinook, Fort Canby and Ilwaco to-day, leaving Main street wharf at 9 o'clock.

The losses by fire on the Pacific coast during the past six months were as follows: January, \$156,218; February, \$131,626; March, \$129,551; April, \$126,542; May, \$122,321; June, \$228,681. Total, \$1,003,933.

The government barge "Chinook" loaded rock at Bigby's Hole last Friday, and went down to Fort Stevens yesterday.

The following postoffices in Oregon have been discontinued: Adamsville, Wasco county, mail to Alkali; Dana, Yamhill county, mail to Lafayette; Wallawa, Union county, mail to Lostine; Willowa, Umatilla county, mail to Alkali.

A. L. McIntosh came down here from Portland a few days ago and "acted kind of funny" for a while, finally assaulting several citizens.

The list of vessels on the way show a noticeable increase. At present the O. R. & N. steamers, with their long passage and frequent cargoes cannot carry all the grain offered.

The Kinsale and Ann Millicent have arrived out. The latter vessel was 155 days hence at Corvallis, her long passage had aroused apprehension as to her ultimate safety.

The steamer Sam will go to Clatsop this morning, leaving West at Thompson's dock at eight o'clock and returning at 6 p. m. This is a fine chance to spend a day at the seaside.

An alarm of fire was telephoned from the Occident Packing Co.'s premises yesterday and the department started out on the roadway on the jump.

W. Lunsier of San Francisco has engaged in the photograph business with Crow the leading photographer.

A class of instrumental music for the instruction of Violin, Piano, Organ and Guita will be organized, if sufficient patronage is insured within the next week.

Parties are in town negotiating for the construction of an auxiliary steam vessel to carry lumber from the Columbia river, the capacity to be about 500,000 feet of lumber.

RETRENCHMENT. Orders were received in Portland last Friday from Secretary Manning of the treasury department, to reduce the working force in the custom house in that city one-half, which was accordingly done by the dismissal of seven employees.

Inquiry at the custom house in this city develops the fact that no such orders have been received of a similar nature, though it is not considered unlikely that there may be a slight curtailment of the clerical force. The receipts at the Astoria custom house show considerable falling off in the past year.

A comparatively recent reduction made the tax on inbound foreign vessels six cents a ton, instead of thirty cents a ton; admitted vessels from Victoria, at three cents a ton, instead of thirty and gave free admission to vessels from the isthmus.

EASTERN SALMON SHIPMENTS.

Before the Columbia river canneries had direct rail connection with the east, says the Portland Journal of Commerce, the subject of the ultimate destination of the portion of the pack consumed in the United States was not of striking importance.

In addition to the above there were also the following tons of barreled salmon shipped from The Dalles east: To New York, 112; Chicago, 21; Vinton, Iowa, 2; Des Moines, 11; Cedar Rapids, 11; Ottawa, 11 - Total 168.

During the same year, the tonnage of British Columbia canned salmon sent east via Portland appears as follows: To London, 40; Montreal, 27; Kingston, 23; Ottawa, 11; Hamilton, 12; Toronto, 42; Stantford, 27; Winnipeg, 11; St. John's, N. B., 11; Louisville, Ky., 23; Memphis, 24 - Total 1916.

British Columbia also shipped 21 tons of barreled salmon to Montreal and 10 tons to Brookville - Total 31.

Summary. Columbia river canned salmon 5,541, barreled 1,016. British Columbia canned " 1,016, barreled " 31. Grand total 6,756.

Hot weather in the east is killing people by the score. Strikers at Cleveland, Ohio, are buying large quantities of ammunition, and grave trouble is feared.

Eight hundred men left Euclair, Wisconsin, yesterday, to engage in construction work on the Rocky mountain division of the Canadian Pacific railroad.

Francis Kernan, of New York, has declined the appointment of government director of the Union Pacific railway, recently tendered him by the president.

Josiah Evans' house was burned at Gratiot, Clearfield county, Penn., on the 10th. Six children, from six to fifteen years of age, perished in the flames.

The Canadian house of commons, on Friday afternoon, unanimously adopted a vote of thanks to the officers and men engaged in suppressing the north-west rebellion, and voted \$-5.00 to General Middleton.

Few in London believe there is any serious cause for alarm in the new phase of the Afghan boundary question. A special Russian commissioner in London expresses confidence that Salisbury would never fight for the miserable strip of territory now in dispute.

Some military experts declare that the territory will give absolute command of Zulfikar pass, and thence of Herat. These officers insist that a conflict is inevitable, but war talk is almost wholly confined to army circles, and their wish is understood to be father to the thought.

It is noticed that naval officers are less belligerent in their talk, and it is suggested that their change of tone may be due to recent exposures of attacks in British war vessels, the proved inefficiency of torpedo boats, and the practical failure of cruisers.
