GRANT'S LAST MOMENTS. The president of the United States has just received the sad tidings of the death of that illustrious citizen and ex-president of the United States, General Ulysses S. Grant, at Mt. McGregor, in the state of New York, to which place he had lately been removed in an endeavor to prolong his life. In making this announcement to the people of the United States the president is impressed with the magnitude of the public loss of a military leader, who was in the hour of victory magnanimous, and amid disciser screne and self-sustained. Who, in every station, whether as a soldier or as a chief magistrate twice called to power by his fellow-countrymen, trod unswervingly the pathway of duty, undetered by doubt, single-minded and straightforward. The entire country has witnessed with deep emotion his prolonged and patient struggle with

him dead—tenderly mindful of his virtues, his great patriotic services and the loss occasioned by his death. 
