The oil experts, with their boring apparatus, have arrived, and began operations last Monday. The indications, the Pennsylvania

men say, are the best they ever saw, and the confidence in striking a flowing well is very great.

The oil so far found is what is known as "amber," and burns in a lamp readily without being refined. It is of the highest known grade. It is anticipated that the borers will con-sume thirty days time in sinking the

well 1,500 feet.

There is already considerable excitement over the affair in Tacoma, and oil prospectors are out in every direction.

The importance of this discovery, should it prove that flowing wells are plenty, cannot be over estimated. With oil in plenty the country around Tacoma could supply the entire Pa-cific coast and the whole country for at least half way across the continent. Washington territory may yet have its coal oil Tommys, and as Colonel Sellers would say, "There's millions in it." in it.
