THE "GAZETTE'S" CHARGES TRUE.

LONDON, July 29.—The committee to inquire into the recent statements of the Pall Mall Gazette regarding London vice, has made the following report: "Having been requested to inquire as to the truth of the statements printed in the Pall Mall Gazette from July 6 to July 10, we decided from the first to exclude inquiry as to the charges against particular men, classes of men, or against police."

Deputy United States Surveyor Jeff D. Fenton, of McMinnville, has a contract for surveying the boundaries of the Siletz Indian reservation. There are about 300 square miles in this reservation, but the limits have never been marked.

The locks at the falls of the Willamette at Oregon City will be closed on August 15th for two weeks for repairs. The gates are not in the best condition, and will be replaced by new and substantial ones; also two new gates will be built to be used in case of emergency.

The steamer North Pacific, which was injured on Puget sound some time since, is to be repaired. The crossheads are broken and the machinery is out of order. The boat will also undergo a thorough overhauling. The total cost of repairs will be about \$10,000.
